

#### TEACHER ASSISTANCE FUND

We are also developing plans and raising funds for a Teachers Assistance Fund. This program would cover requests for books, equipment, software, and educational programs - important funding that would not be available through the school system. Most of our teachers volunteer their free time and purchase supplies for their students and their classroom out of their own personal funds. Teachers are underpaid for the critical role they play in the emotional, educational, and physical development of our young people. We want to continue to create the best possible atmosphere at Grimsley, one that will attract and keep the best possible teachers, in an environment that will recognize and appreciate their contributions.

There has always been a concern that Grimsley will be penalized for meeting some of its needs through private funding – such as that provided by the Alumni Association – that the school system would escape from some of its own financial responsibility. The administration at Grimsley has assured us that this has not happened so far. We will continue to monitor this closely and demand that it never happens. This organization is still young and growing, still maintained by dedicated volunteers. There is much we still need to learn and improve on. Thank you for your patience and support. Together we have made a real difference. Let us continue this work together.

# A NEW \$100,000 SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT

In 1945, at the age of 23, Army Pfc. Sigmund Pearl lost his life in the Battle of the Bulge. Three years after his death, Sigmund's parents were looking for a way to honor their son. At the time, Greensboro Senior High School Stadium (now Jamieson Stadium) was being built. The need for war supplies was causing a shortage of building materials, thus increasing construction Although the stadium was near completion, there were no funds for a field house. Coach Jamieson had been raising money for a field house, but contributions were far short of the \$25,000 needed. Charlie and Kate Pearl stepped up to the plate, donating the remaining \$20,000 needed to build the field house in their son's memory. The Sigmund Selig Pearl Field House was first opened for the 1950 The field house, while football season. named in Sigmund's honor, recognizes all of the alumni of Greensboro Senior High School that lost their lives in World War II


Betty Pearl, Sigmund's youngest sister, was just a sophomore at Greensboro Senior High School when Sigmund died. She graduated in 1948 and attended Women's College (now UNC-G), University of Miami, and University of Wisconsin-Madison, where she received her Master's degree in Psychology. That same year, she married J. Richard Simon and subsequently had two daughters. In 1957, Betty and Dick moved to Iowa, where she became a psychologist for the Child Psychiatry Department at University Hospitals and Clinics.

Betty Pearl Simon spent the next 44 years of her life helping others. She volunteered at the Iowa City Crisis Center for 28 years where she spent nine years on the Crisis Center Board of Directors. She also volunteered for the Domestic Violence Intervention Project, Big Brother/Big Sisters, Ronald McDonald House and the "Rock and Read" program at the local elementary schools. In addition, she and both her older sisters, Dorothy and Rita, contributed money to help renovate the Sigmund Pearl Field House in 1986.

On November 21, 2001 Betty lost her battle against pancreatic cancer. As high school friend Shirley Freedman said, "When Betty said she didn't feel well, we knew the end was close. Betty never complained about anything."

Sigmund Pearl, whose life was brief, is memorialized with the Sigmund Pearl Field House. His sister Betty, who lived a full life dedicated to helping others, will also be memorialized at Grimsley, thanks to Betty's husband, Dr. J. Richard Simon, Dr. Simon has endowed \$100,000 to establish a perpetual scholarship in his wife's memory. His stipulation for this scholarship - that the recipient show the same degree of dedication to volunteerism and helping the community as his late wife. Dr. Simon has asked the Alumni Association to award this scholarship annually, and the Alumni Association is making arrangements for this endowment to be managed by a community foundation.

A brother and a sister - both will be forever remembered at Grimsley High School.
