

We've Only Just Begun

The first year of membership in the Greensboro Grimsley Senior High School Alumni & Friends Association has come to an end. And we could not have made such great accomplishments to date without the growing enthusiasm of this group. As of October 1997, we have raised an amazing \$56,704 with a strong membership of more than 700 alumni and friends.

You all have been so generous, and we need your continued support of this worthwhile cause! So, with the onset of our second year upon us, the Association is issuing a challenge to each of you who has been receiving this newsletter. PHYLLIS HAGEDORN FINESHRIBER CLASS OF 1933

I have a particular memory to share...I've thought of it much in recent years, particularly since the advent of the Holocaust Museum in Washington, but also when I visited the Holocaust Museum in Enschede, Holland, accompanying my surviving Dutch Jewish cousins. My memory is of graduating 7th in the class of 1933 (of 307 class members) and receiving the Short Story Prize that year from the O'Henry Study Club. The title of my story was "Ye Have Done it Unto Me," a Biblical quotation meant to illuminate the beginnings of the Holocaust in Germany (though the word came later). The fate of the Jews in Germany and later on much of Europe was deeply meaningful to me, at age 16 in those fateful years. My mother had visited her German relatives in Frankfurt before World War I and a cousin wanted to marry her. One of our Dutch cousins had visited us in Greensboro. I felt close to these people and needed to write about them. The wonder to me is that the ladies from the O'Henry Study Club were moved by the story to give me the prize! I have told this story many times to people who say that Americans of that time did not know what was happening in Hitler Germany.

Presently, I work as a volunteer in "Hillaryland," the First Lady's office, every Monday. I enjoy it and have had a lot of fun knowing the staff, as well as Hillary, whom I regard as the First Lady for all time!

ROBERT (BOB) M. STANLEY CLASS OF 1959

In May '96 I had to have a tumor removed that was on the vagus nerve, very near my brain stem. Except for its being benign, everything else that could go wrong, did. In fact, on five different occasions, my twin sister, Sue, was told that I would not live. By the grace of God, I did, but had to learn how to speak and swallow again. This, coupled with complications from a back injury I sustained in 1989, forced me to retire from 30 years of post-graduate mental health practice. For the past 24 years, I was a therapist and court-appointed examiner in an adult outpatient unit in Greenwood, S.C. I continue to improve slowly.

My twin sister, Sue Stanley Carlan, died on January 17, 1997 in Florence, S.C. of renal failure secondary to diabetes mellitus, which she had for over 25 years. For the last 15 years of her life, she lived in Surfside Beach, S.C. and for the last six was an instructor in Biology at Horry-Georgetown Technical College. She primarily taught anatomy and physiology to nursing students. Unfortunately, for four of those years she spent most of her time either in a wheelchair or a bed because she had lost her right leg below the knee due to the diabetes. Though she was a brittle diabetic, with many complications, the quality of her life was good because she was involved in work and a church which she loved dearly.



Once again, thank you for your help. Our goals are both necessary and noble, and together we can and will make a difference.



Congratulations Coach Sawyer!

Earlier this year Coach Bob Sawyer (GHS '55) was inducted into the North Carolina High School Athletic Association's Hall of Fame, joining a select group of only about 40 coaches (including GHS's Coach Bob Jamieson, who was inducted into the Hall's first class in 1987). Coach Sawyer was honored both as a champion backstroker—he swam on three state-championship teams at Greensboro Senior High for Coach Pat Earey in the 1950's—as well as for his many years of coaching both men's and women's swimming and men's track at his alma mater. He coached fifteen consecutive men's swim teams to state championships (1965-1979)—more state crowns in one sport than any other high school coach in North Carolina history—as well as two women's teams that won the state title, in 1978 and 1979. Today Coach Sawyer is in his thirty-seventh year on the Grimsley faculty—its most senior member—and continues in the position of Athletic Director, which he has held since 1975.

GHS Continues Tradition of Excellence both in the Classroom and on the Field

The Academic and Athletic achievements of Grimsley's students continue to astound us as their level of success rises to meet the challenges set before them each year. The 1996-97 School year was yet another for the record books.

The 1997 Graduating Class won an amazing \$4.2 Million in scholarships, most of which were academic. In a class of 236 students, 76% were to attend 4-year colleges, while 21% enrolled in 2-year schools. Their mean SAT score was 1070.

On a scale of 1-5 (5 being the best), Advanced Placement test results scored 21% of students with 5s, 27% with a score of 4 or better and 71% of students taking the AP exams scored a 3 or better. The real succes lies in the fact that most colleges will give a semester of college credit for scores of 3 or better in that subject.


GHS Athletics also continued its tradition of excellence in the 1996-97 School year. Women's Tennis, Men's Tennis and Women's Soccer all were conference champions, and despite a 6th place regular season finish, the Baseball Team won its conference tournament.

An astonishing 69 students earned All-Conference honors, with special recognition going to Brent Phipps as Men's Soccer "Goalie of the Year," Dion Hicks "Wrestler of the Year" and State Champion, Abby Stallworth was conference "Swimmer of the Year" and Sarah Atkinson was Women's Soccer "Player of the Year," Ist-team All-State and All-South. Coaches Randy Alexander and Suzanne Bandy were honored as Conference "Coach of the Year" in Men's and Women's Tennis, respectively.

Grimsley finished in 2nd place in the Conference "Best All-Around" Sports program for 1996-97. In the 21-year history of this program, GHS has placed 1st fourteen times, 2nd place six times and 3rd place once. Grimsley has won the State 4-A Wachovia Cup "Best All-Around" sports program five times, and the Whirlies have won a total of 95 State Titles, which is the greatest number of championships won by any high school.

Quite an honor to be recognized, the '96-'97 high school athletes were also judged throughout the entire school year on their sportsmanship toward their fellow competitors. GHS never had a student suspended from an athletic contest, and in fact was given the award for the most outstanding sportsmanship among North Carolina 4-A schools --- an honor we should all be proud of.

In addition to the sucess of the students on the playing field, these athletes should also be recognized for their outstanding scholarship. The '96-'97 Men's swimming team won State honors for the highest Fall Semester grade-point average with a 3.727. Other teams earning State recognition for scholarship during the Fall Semester were Women's swimming, 3.5, Women's cross country, 3.7, Women's tennis, 3.5, Men's soccer, 3.2, Men's cross country, 3.5 and Cheerleading, 3.2. A total of 107 students during the Fall Semester earned a 3.5 GPA or better.

The Larry Saunders Scholarship Fund

The Grimsley Alumni Association is pleased to announce the creation of the Larry Saunders Scholarship Fund and the beginning of a \$40,000 fundraising drive to support this scholarship. Named in honor of one of the great teachers in school history, Larry Saunders taught math at GHS for 28 years until his recent retirement in 1996. His legendary teaching career touched thousands of students.

To get this fund raising drive started, members of the Grimsley class of '82 have issued a fundraising challenge. "For every three dollars given by every other class, the class of '82 will match with a dollar, up to the \$40,000 goal." said Grimsley Alumni Association member Max Lloyd. "It is a privilege to honor Mr. Saunders. His humor, toughness, interest in his students accomplishments and expectations of success were building blocks of hundreds of successful careers."

Sunita Chandra Patterson, a 1982 graduate, said, "Mr. Saunders was a great teacher. He gave the clearest of explanations. He had high expectations and even motivated this slack student to do her homework. And he could draw perfect circles on the board freehand!

Because of Mr.Saunders, I still like math. I wish him all the best in his retirement."

For most of us, it is perhaps best said by John Studders, an '82 GHS student who is now director of software development for Avant! Corp. in the Research Triangle, "Larry Saunders was without a doubt the most influential teacher that I had in all of my education. His dedication to excellence and commitment to his students and their education was amazing. He made a difficult subject (AP Calculus) enjoyable and understandable and achieved amazing results. As a professional, I respect and admire anyone with that kind of commitment to their profession. As a student, I thank him for giving so much of himself in order to challenge me to

overachieve in math and in life (as Mr. Saunders would say, "math is life"). His lessons are still used by me every day in my personal and professional life. Thank you Mr. Saunders."

The Larry Saunders Scholarship Award will be a merit-based scholarship for mathematics excellence, given yearly, going to a Grimsley student who attends college in North Carolina and who does not receive additional scholarship funding. Initial plans are to offer the first scholarship to a member of the class of 1999. Please make your pledge soon and see if your employer offers matching funds. A page from the History book . . .

Fund-raising projects are currently underway for much-needed repairs and improvements on two Grimsley landmarks—the John Barnes Chance-M. Thomas Cousins Auditorium and the Robert B. Jamieson Stadium. Many alumni may not be aware of an interesting connection between these facilities as well as with several others on the GHS campus: a number of the capital improvements made at Greensboro Senior High School during the Depression and early in World War II were made by the federal government via several of the "alphabet soup" agencies of President Franklin D. Roosevelt's New Deal.

Following are the New-Deal projects carried out at GHS:

1) 1934—The school auditorium was painted for the first time, with Raleigh-artist James A. McLean hired to paint the room's two murals, representing Energy and Education. Sponsored by the Civil Works Administration's (CWA) Public Works of Art Project (PWAP).

2) 1938—A dirt, practice track was constructed in the area where the Vocational Building and the bus parking lot are today. Built by the Works Projects Administration (WPA).

3) 1939—The Auxiliary Gymnasium built; its first use was as a combination band and shop building with the name "Music and Arts Building." It became the "Girls' Gym"—its intended use—in 1942 and received its current name in 1977. Built by the Public Works Administration (PWA).

4) 1941—Construction begun on the Greensboro Senior High School Stadium. The Works Projects Administration (WPA) helped pay for the stadium during its early construction, as well as moved tons of dirt from the scrub-pine covered, naturally sloping area on campus chosen as the stadium's site. World War II and then a lack of funds stalled the project; the stadium finally opened in 1949 after the remaining financing was done by the school board and by the selling of private bonds in Greensboro. The stadium was named for Coach Bob Jamieson in 1975.

5) 1941-1942—The Vocational Building was built. Originally referred to as the "Technical Building," it was constructed by the Works Projects Administration (WPA).



With the first year of being at the helm of Whirlie Country, Principal Jane Teague has nothing but good things to say about Greensboro Grimsley Senior High School. She had a busy year moving into her position and aiming to fill the big shoes left behind by a long and distinguished list of GHS Principals. But, she says, "After one year, I've made the transition and I feel like I belong."

The first sign she noticed that she was becoming a true part of this wonderful place we all like to call "home" was when she began referring to GHS as "my school" and calling the students there "our kids." It's true, you become a part of Greensboro Grimsley when you hang around there long enough, and it's a feeling that will never leave you. She really felt a part of things when the students asked her to lead an 'unauthorized' parade to Page High School on the day of the Grimsley vs. Page football game this Fall. And as much as she would have loved to be a part of such an event, in the interest of the school, she declined the invitation. But she did wear the "beat Page" t'shirts and buttons and attended the other activities --- right down to the bonfire.

"What's special about Grimsley kids is they are so polite and do what you ask them to do --- you can't ask for anything more," Principal Teague commented on her experience with the students thus-far. But probably the biggest compliment she could give the students and the alumni who consider themselves among a 'special' group of people to have walked those halls was when she declared, "I'm a Whirlie now."
